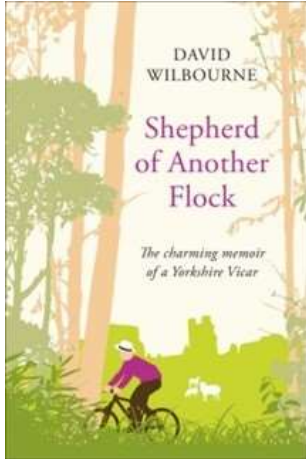
Worthy worship – enabling worship to be moving and converting, including a deep commitment to prayer and teaching.
